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Section D1: U.K. Terms and Conditions for the Wheeled Tanker Program

Revised: August 8, 2023

The U.K. Wheeled Tanker Contract No. **703040452** is a program of the United Kingdom Ministry of Defense ("U.K. MoD"). In order to ensure that certain legal requirements under the prime contract are consistently observed throughout the supply chain, Oshkosh Defense, LLC requires that you accept certain additional U.K. MoD contracting terms and conditions. These terms and conditions are called "DEFCONs," which is an MoD abbreviation for "Defense Contracts Conditions." Although DEFCONs are flowed down to suppliers much like the FAR and DFARS clauses contained in U.S. Defense Department contracts, their content is not necessarily similar to comparable FAR and DFARS clauses. Accordingly, please carefully note the contents of these DEFCONs.

The referencing and reproduction, in this section of the Supplier Standards Guide, of the appropriate U.K. MoD DEFCONs shall conclusively establish their applicability, as well as their incorporation into this Purchase Order, with the same force and effect as though set forth in the Purchase Order itself.

Where the provisions of a listed DEFCON conflict with any other term or condition contained in this Purchase Order, the DEFCON shall govern.

## **Definitions**

In order to effect the parties' intent to flow down and accept the listed DEFCONs as between Oshkosh Defense, LLC and the Supplier, the listed terms shall generally be given the following meanings, unless the context dictates otherwise or unless subject to an interpretive note as indicated in the <u>DEFCON Interpretive Notes</u> below:

- "Contractor" shall mean Supplier.
- "Contract" shall mean the Purchase Order between Oshkosh Defense, LLC and Supplier.
- "Authority" shall mean Oshkosh Defense, LLC unless it is clear from the context of the DEFCON that "Authority" must refer to the U.K. Government or MoD in order to effect the essential purpose of the DEFCON as between Oshkosh Defense, LLC and Supplier.
- "Article" means the item or items to be furnished under the Purchase Order.
